Acknowledged by critics and audiences on both sides of the Atlantic as one of the most accomplished and versatile players of his generation, Kim Heindel's interpretations have been praised as both "masterly" (American Record Guide) and "boldly declamatory" (Classical Disc Digest).

He has concertized widely on the organ, harpsichord, and lautenwerk, a gut-strung keyboard instrument which was of particular interest to Bach. He has championed this unique and intriguing instrument through lectures and performances in concert halls in the United States, Canada and Germany.

His pioneering first CD on the lautenwerk was named to *Gramophone* magazine's Critics' Choice List. In addition to the complete organ works of Bach, his repertoire includes many of the great organ masterworks of the 19th and 20th centuries.
